

 Significant discrepancies between the credits stated in the KYC documents and the declared revenue - Disclosed as Other income

<u>Information gathered by the FIAU</u>

Legitimate business

- Tobacco business 5 Stores, normal financial activity, adequate employed personnel
- Legitimate purchase of textiles from local and European suppliers

Suspicious Financial Activity

- Textiles business = 70% of the company's total operations Other income?
- Cash deposits = 64% of the credits Exports?
- In 2020, Malta Fabrics Ltd received EUR 150,000 from Sudan Solutions Ltd

Pattern of Suspicious Transactions in Textiles

- Low profit margins (4% vs. the industry average of 22%) and significant sales variance
- Sudan nationals transferred funds to Malta Fabrics Ltd with vague narratives like "Payment for shirts", "Clothes invoices" and "loan repayment". These amounted to 20% of the company's credits.



Possible TF (Sudan) Placement Layerin stage, sudan. Layering - FT Mr Agius UBO and Aiding Sudanese customers **UBO** Sudan which may be accountant, possible tax to layer cash deposits locally indicative to TF evasion and carousel fraud from these clients for possibly non existent transactions
